Employment with Miami County Sheriff's Office

Salary Information: Starting pay is \$17.82/hour with a top pay of \$20.87/hour after completing all the steps under the current contract.

Benefit Information: The Miami County Sheriff's Office offers an attractive and competitive fringe benefits package.

- Health Insurance: MedBen administers the Health Insurance plan for physicians and hospital services covering employee, spouse and children. The family health insurance plan will only cover a spouse who cannot get health insurance through their current employer.
- Life Insurance: Benefit of \$20,000.00 plus an option to purchase additional insurance at reduced rates. Coverage is available for a spouse also.
- Personal Liability Insurance: Professional liability insurance is provided at no cost for \$1,000,000.00 per incident.
- Vacation Time: Two (2) weeks beginning year two (2) for the first eight (8) years; then advances in stages up to five (5) weeks after twenty-two (25) years.
- Clothing and Equipment Allowance: Uniforms are provided at no cost, including uniform dry cleaning.

Description: Corrections officers for the Miami County Sheriff's Office are responsible for the intake and release and daily observation of inmates. Staff rotates work responsibilities between our two facilities. The "Full Service Jail", a linear, bar-style jail located in downtown Troy houses higher-classified inmates, while the "Minimum Security Facility", an open, pod-style jail located on N. CR 25A north of the fairgrounds houses the lower-classified, mainly non-violent inmates. We currently operate on 12-hour shifts from 7a-7p and 7p-7a which offers corrections officers every other weekend off and the ability to work 7 days in a 14 day period. Corrections officers' main responsibility is the care, custody and control of all inmates housed in our facilities.

Corrections Officers can be assigned to:

- Control Room Operations
- Intake and Release of Inmates
- Photographing and fingerprinting inmates
- Direct Supervision of up to 60 inmates in one pod
- Log all daily inmate activities
- Possibility of promotion to Corrections Sergeant or Lieutenant



Testing: The MCSO offers full testing services for the position of corrections officer through National Testing Network, Inc. To fill out an application and schedule a test, go to www.nationaltestingnetwork.com, select "Corrections" and sign up for the Miami County Sheriff's Office

- Take high quality job simulation tests in a standardized, fair testing environment.

Upon completion of the entry level exam, all candidate scores are automatically forwarded to the MCSO. Candidates who attain a passing score will be placed on the department's eligibility list. MCSO will contact candidates on the list and will invite them to continue to participate in other stages of the selection process.
