

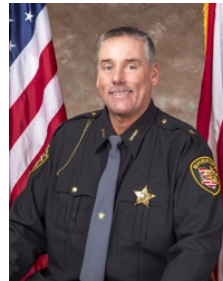


Miami County Sheriff's Office

Employment with Miami County Sheriff's Office

Description: Deputies in the patrol division have the responsibility to provide law enforcement services by handling calls and patrolling the unincorporated areas of Miami County. Deputies also provide the primary law enforcement duties through agreements and contacts to the Village of Bradford, Village of Pleasant Hill, Village of Laura, Village of Fletcher, Village of Casstown, Bethel Township, and the Miami County Park District. Deputies can also be called upon to assist Sheriffs in other counties during emergencies.

Deputies can be assigned to:

- Patrol
- Detective Section
- Court Services
- School Resource Officer
- Special Response Team
- K9
- Crash Reconstruction



Salary Information: Starts at \$22.92 - \$25.31/hour depending on experience. Deputies at top pay in year three of the current contract will make \$29.27/hour.

Benefit Information: The Miami County Sheriff's Office offers an attractive and competitive fringe benefits package.

- Health Insurance: MedBen administers the Health Insurance plan for physicians and hospital services covering the employee, spouse and children. The family health insurance will only cover a spouse who cannot get health insurance through their current employer.
- Life Insurance: Benefit of \$20,000.00 plus an option to purchase additional insurance at reduced rates. Coverage is available for a spouse also.
- Personal Liability Insurance: Professional liability insurance is provided at no cost for \$1,000,000.00 per incident.
- Vacation Time: Two (2) weeks beginning year two (2) for the first eight (8) years; then advances in stages up to five (5) weeks after twenty-two (22) years.
- Clothing and Equipment Allowance: Uniforms are provided at no cost, including uniform dry cleaning.

Testing: The MCSO offers full testing services for the position of deputy sheriff through National Testing Network, Inc. To fill out an application and schedule a test, go to www.nationaltestingnetwork.com, select Law Enforcement and sign up for the Miami County Sheriff's Office

- Completion of the application process
- Review all information related to the MCSO deputy position, including minimum requirements, salary and benefits.
- Detailed information about the testing process.
- Opportunity to take online practice tests at www.frontlinetest.com.
- Schedule your own convenient test time. Tests are offered multiple times a week, including Saturdays.
- Take high quality job simulation tests in a standardized, fair testing environment.

Upon completion of the entry level exam, all candidate scores are automatically forwarded to the MCSO. Candidates who attain a passing score will be placed on the department's eligibility list. MCSO will contact candidates on the list and will invite them to continue to participate in other stages of the selection process.
