

Job Opportunity: Physical Therapist - CONTRACT

POSITION & PROGRAM: Physical Therapist/Early Intervention

POSITION SUMMARY: The licensed Physical Therapist (PT), in compliance with Ohio Board of Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy and Athletic Trainers and Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD) rules and regulations will provide evidence-based early intervention services for gross motor development for infants and toddlers with developmental delays and disabilities. This work will be conducted in the family's natural environments or via tele-health using coaching practices with the child's primary caregivers to expand their confidence and competence in caring for and assisting the child's development.

The PT will provide assessments of development, gross motor and assist families and the Early Intervention team with developing outcomes and strategies that will progress the child's gross motor skills and address the family's concerns according to the IFSP.

As a contractor of the Miami County Board of Developmental Disabilities, the job incumbent shall always comply with all Board policies, and shall demonstrate respect for, support the dignity of, and observe the rights of all individuals served by the Board and demonstrate sensitivity to diverse beliefs, values and family structures.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Bachelor's degree in Physical Therapy
- Must possess and maintain a license from the Ohio Board of Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy and Athletic Trainers.
- Must have at least one (1) year paid work experience in the field of physical therapy
- Must demonstrate the ability to assess the needs of children, develop and implement treatment plans, evaluate and document changes
- May be required to lift, carry and move a child up to 50 lbs in a safe manner
- Possess the ability to work effectively with minimal supervision
- Must support the Family-Centered philosophy
- Strong oral and written communication
- Competency in Microsoft Office applications
- Ability to abide by Riverside's Code of Conduct
- Satisfactory criminal background, abuser registry checks and pre-employment drug
- Possess valid State of Ohio driver's license

DUTIES:

- With the family and other members of the Early Intervention team, plan and develop functional outcomes and evidence-based strategies to support families with eligible children in their daily activities. These strategies require the ability to value diversity in terms of cultural, socio-economic and individualized customer service toward the family and child.
- Complete eligibility evaluations and assessments for program planning, as well as family directed and functional assessments.
- Provide or assist families with appropriate adaptive equipment for their child to be able to function effectively in their natural environment.
- Other duties as assigned
