Said Complaint is set for a **Legal Rights Hearing** set for the 25th day of June, 2026, at 10:00a.m.; an **Adjudicatory Hearing** set for the 25th day of June, 2026, at 10:00a.m.; and a **Dispositional Hearing** set for the 23rd day of July, 2026, at 1:00p.m. before the Miami County Juvenile Court before the Miami County Juvenile Court at the Miami County Safety Building, 201 West Main Street, 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Troy, Ohio, and you are ordered to appear before said Court on said date and show cause why Complainant's prayer should not be granted.

You are hereby notified that:

- I. Any party is entitled to a lawyer at all proceedings in Juvenile Court. If the party cannot afford a lawyer and meets certain requirements the Court will appoint one upon request. If you wish to have a lawyer but believe you cannot afford one, call AC (937) 332-6993, Juvenile Court at Troy, Ohio between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- II. An Order of Permanent Custody will permanently divest the parent's rights and responsibilities
- III. An Order of Temporary Custody will cause the removal of the child from the parent(s) physical and legal custody until the court terminates the order or permanently divests the parent of all parental rights.
- IV. An Order of Protective Supervision will permit the child to remain in the parent(s) physical and legal custody subject to any conditions and limitations the court prescribes.
- V. An Order of Legal Custody will result in granting parental rights to a relative or third party with the parent holding residual rights.
