

PHASE PROGRAM:

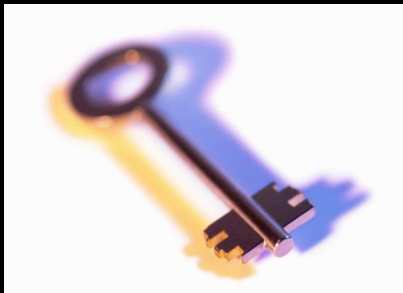
This program allows each youth to set and accomplish goals. It enables each youth to make the right decisions by establishing rewards and consequences for their actions.

EDUCATION:

School will be conducted year round. The youths' home school are encouraged to provide assignments when appropriate. (Parents will be responsible for transporting assignments to and from the schools.) Tutors are available to work individually with youth.

SPIRITUAL:

Church service is offered by a variety of churches each Sunday. Volunteer groups conduct Bible study on Monday and Thursday evenings. Attendance to all religious programming is voluntary.



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R esponsibility



This program is set up for unruly youth who are at risk of being introduced into the Juvenile Court System. The program impresses upon them the reality of life in a locked facility. The juvenile court must make a referral for youth to participate in this program. Parent/guardian must attend with the youth.

MISSION STATEMENT

West Central Juvenile Detention Center provides a safe and secure placement for delinquent youth who are being detained as a result of a court order or pursuant to the laws of arrest. Strict discipline and fair treatment will help youth understand the consequences of poor decision-making and encourage the growth and changes necessary to become a positive and productive members of our community.

DIRECTIONS

West Central Juvenile Detention Center is located at 2044 N. Co. Rd. 25a, Troy, OH 45373. From I-75 take exit #78 and turn right. West Central is about two miles south of the exit on the right side of the road behind Jobs and Family Services.



Items the parent / guardian will need to provide:

1. Prescription medication
2. A pair of gym shoes

Items the parent / guardian may provide:

1. Stamps—paper—envelopes are provided to write parent/guardian, court officials and attorney. Letter writing materials may be brought in for the resident to write others.
2. Books (no magazines) can be donated and will become part of the facility library rather than being returned to the resident.

PHONE CALLS:

Residents are permitted to call their parent / guardian upon intake. Residents will be allowed to make one (1) phone call per week. Additional phone privileges will be granted with good behaviors with the Phase Program. Residents are not permitted to receive incoming calls.

VISITATION

Only parents /legal guardian, stepparents and grandparents may visit. Visitation is by appointment only on Wednesday evening and Saturday afternoon for 20 minutes. Children of detained youth may visit, but must be accompanied by the detained youth's parent(s), not the mother or father of the child. No other children are allowed to enter the secure area and should not be brought to a visit.

Call (937) 440-3485 X5431 to schedule a visit. A state issued photo ID is required to enter the facility. All visitors will undergo security screening.

To be proactive in reducing the spread of influenza, no visitor will be permitted to enter the facility currently displaying obvious signs of illness. Anyone that is ill with the flu is asked to reschedule their visit at a later date when they are no longer contagious.

Signs of the flu: fever, body aches, fatigue, sore throat, headache
